Central City Lutheran Mission Reentry Services

Central City Lutheran Mission (CCLM) is listed by the California Department of Corrections as a potential resource for the population going through reentry from a period of incarceration. It is important to note that CCLM does <u>not</u> operate its own Residential Reentry Program, or a Drug Rehabilitation Program.

For a wide variety of needs that might arise during reentry transition, the 2-1-1 Reentry Program is specially trained and available to assist. You might want to consult the 2-1-1 brochure "Obtaining Important Documents". Having documents in order is a critical first step, and this document also has some excellent tips regarding some of the emotional challenges of this transition time.

Please note that CCLM cannot intake 290 registered sex offenders and being at the CCLM campus has previously been found to constitute a parole and probation violation for those with child-based sex offenses and restrictions.

CCLM does have make variety of services available to the San Bernardino community, including those making reentry:

- Our weekday noon hot meal open to the community.
- Grocery distribution the first and third Tuesdays of the month
- Office referrals and resource lists to other known local resources.
- Emergency men's shelter with 30-60-90 day case-managed program including breakfast, dinner, clothing, and other assistance for homeless men committed to progressing towards income and housing stability.
- Supportive housing program for individuals living with HIV/AIDS.
- Sunday evening (5:00 p.m.) worship ending in a meal. (Monthly during the summer, weekly otherwise.)
- Supportive meetings and training spaces for:
 - Narcotics Anonymous
 - English as a Second Language
- Community computer lab on non-holiday weekdays from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.
- Community service work & supervision for those assigned by the court.
- Operation of one house for CalState Reentry Initiative (CSRI) students. Program entry and case management is through CSRI.
